Dear colleagues

Our heavy workload continues as we move into the winter months. It's been a busy time at a YORLMC level too. You will receive the regular updates from Dr Brian McGregor, YORLMC Medical Secretary, and the YORLMC newsletter which detail work done - below are updates on just a couple of issues currently being looked at on a BAWC level:

Secondary to primary care shift

Inappropriate transfer of work from hospitals adds significantly to GP workload. Discussions have taken place between YORLMC, Hospital Trusts and the CCG to agree a way to improve communication between GPs and Secondary Care Consultants. A joint communication from YORLMC and the CCG has been sent to practice managers setting out arrangements for a new directory of contacts allowing GPs to make easier contact with consultants and vice versa. We all hope this will help improve communication and give both GPs and consultants an easier route to flag concerns.

We are also asking practices to tally examples of transfer of work and share with YORLMC to help assess the scale of the problem. Thanks to everyone who is helping with this, it will really help to inform our ongoing discussions with commissioners.

NHS Property Services – service charge disputes

Disputes over service charges levied by NHSPS is a national problem — there's more information on the <u>BMA website</u> about the latest situation. In terms of YORLMC's current position on the general situation, the new imposed charges are still under dispute and our advice to practices is not to pay the new charges unless agreement has been reached, but we have advised practices that they should pay any historically agreed fees if the practice is content with the legality and accuracy of them, whilst clearly indicating they do not agree or accept the new imposed charges. Practices should at least be paying up to the 2015 levels (prior to NHSPS centralising all operations) and may wish to hold funds in reserve to cover any balance once any dispute has been settled.
