### Rebuild General Practice campaign

Thank you to all colleagues who are engaging with the Rebuild GP campaign on social media. This important campaign calls for:

- **Recruitment:** The UK Government delivering on its commitment of an additional 6,000 GPs in England by 2024.
- **Retention:** Tackling the factors driving GPs out of the profession such as burn out.
- **Safety:** A plan to reduce GP workload and in turn improve patient safety.

The latest phase of the campaign is in the form of a <u>Letter to my Patients</u> – an open letter signed by GPs across the country, including me and others in our area – setting out the challenges we face in delivering the excellent care we all want to offer to our patients.

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## *Meet the team* Dr Charles Strachan



Dr Charles Strachan is the YORLMC Locality Officer for Bradford and has just been elected to GPC UK for a one year term from the Conference of UK LMCs . He is a partner at Low Moor Medical Practice in Bradford. He also serves as Chair of the CCG Council for Bradford Districts and Craven, which will finish on 30 June this year.

The GPC (general practitioners committee) is an important national body, representing all GPs in the UK. It deals with all matters affecting NHS GPs, regardless of BMA membership. Charles joins YORLMC Medical Secretary <u>Dr Brian McGregor</u> on GPC UK: Charles's seat is elected by the UK LMC Conference with a term of one year;

Brian is the GPC representative for Bradford & Airedale and North Yorkshire & York.

In his role as YORLMC Locality Officer for Bradford, Charles is part of a team of GPs leading YORLMC's work across Bradford, Airedale, Wharfedale & Craven, providing clinical leadership and representing GPs. Alternating with Dr Laura Molyneux (AWC Locality Officer), Charles chairs the bi-monthly BAWC locality meetings to which all GPs and Practice Managers in the area are invited and are very welcome to attend. #### Medical exemption service

As of 12 May 2022 the domestic NHS COVID Pass is no longer available, and the medical exemptions service (119) will no longer accept new applications from people who want to use the domestic NHS COVID Pass to prove they cannot be vaccinated for medical reasons.

The 119 service will continue running at a minimal level until 11 July, only accepting queries to the call centre and processing outstanding applications via GP assessments into the Summary Care Record application (SCRa). GPs will be required to continue processing applications until 11 July to comply with the amendments to GP regulations. Previously granted exemptions will continue to show throughout in the NHS Covid Pass under "view my records" except where they have expired due to time-limited grounds.

The NHS COVID Pass for international travel will continue to be available as normal. More information about medical exemptions can be found on gov.uk.

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## **UK LMC Conference 2022**

Representatives from Bradford & Airedale LMC and North Yorkshire LMC attended the Annual Conference of Representatives of LMCs on 10 & 11 May. This conference brought together LMC reps from across the UK to debate a range of motions, helping to set GPC UK policy.

The conference voted through a motion calling on the national GPCs renegotiating the GMS contracts to include workload limits in order to protect patients and staff. Motions looking at GP working hours, social media and GP training were also debated. ## **GPC ARM elections**

Nominations are open for 10 seats on <u>GPC UK</u> for a one-session term. At least one seat will have their principal place of work in England, one in Northern Ireland, one in Scotland and one in Wales, and be elected by the RB as a whole. <u>Find out</u> what you can expect as a committee member

To stand in this election, you must be a BMA member and have a BMA online account. Nominations will close at 10am on Monday, 27 June. <u>Nominate yourself at elections.bma.org.uk</u>. Voting will take place during the <u>ARM</u> on 27–29 June. Voting is open to delegates of the ARM only.

## Patient access to their GP-held records

As advised in a previous edition of the newsletter, patient access to GP records is now due to be launched in the summer. NHSE/I are running a series of webinars which may be of interest to practices – more details, including how to book, are available <u>here</u>.

## Delayed contractual changes for deceased patient records

NHSE/I have confirmed that the contractual changes for the management of deceased patient records have yet to take effect. This is due to required legislative and system changes remaining outstanding and means that practices should continue printing and sending the full records to PCSE until NHSE/I notifies the profession otherwise. PCSE will also retain the obligation to process AHRA requests it receives directly until that time.

## Improvements to benefit eligibility at the end of life

On Monday 4 April 2022, eligibility for the Special Rules changed. This means that individuals can make a fast-tracked claim to two working age benefits if they have an estimated 12 months or less to live.
