Investment and Impact fund (IIF) respiratory indicators

The Investment and Impact Fund recommenced in full on 1 April 2022, with four respiratory indicators. These aim to improve the UK's poor asthma outcomes, whilst reducing carbon emissions from pressurised Metered Dose Inhalers (pMDIs). The indicators reward Primary Care Networks for: improving regular steroid inhaler prescribing and reducing SABA overuse for patients with asthma, reducing the proportion of non-salbutamol pMDIs, and prescribing lower carbon salbutamol inhalers.

A [asthma toolkit](#) has been produced to support practices to achieve these IIF indicators, integrating high quality and low carbon care as part of a shared decision-making process with patients. It contains educational videos, step-by-step projects, downloadable searches for EMIS and System One practices, asthma templates and pre-written patient communication material.
