Our second YORLMC Conference held on 18 October in Harrogate built on the success of the inaugural Conference last year.

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Established 2007

It was well attended by GPs, practice managers and other primary care staff with consistently high quality speakers and themes relevant to the challengers primary care is currently facing. Further information including delegate feedback is included in the October YORLMC Newsletter.

I also recently attended a half day workshop with CCGs, NHSE and NYCC colleagues on the New Zealand Canterbury model of integrated health care. The size and demography of the Canterbury system shares significant similarities with our own and would be potentially transferable to a North Yorkshire and York population. A key feature was increased support and resources for independent contractor GPs strengthening the partnership model with ambitious but supported pathway redesign.

I have also represented the North Yorkshire Branch at a series of planned meetings in York to address concerns on RSS, referral for expert opinion proposals and the wider issue of GP representation and a single voice in the York locality.

YORLMC believes it is a critical time in all North Yorkshire CCG areas to work with GP Federations and CCGs to establish where effective, accountable and mandated GP representation as <u>Primary care networks</u> and <u>Integrated Care Providers</u> (ICP) develop.
