Chair's introduction

YORLMC NY Branch Chair, YORLMC Ltd



Following on from the [January edition](#) and the publication of the [NHS Long Term Plan](#) and [GP partnership](#) review the third and most important document for General Practice - [Investment and Evolution: a five-year framework for GP Contract reform to implement the NHS Long term plan](#) has now been published. This is the most significant GP Contract overhaul since the 2004 Contract and has been well received both locally and nationally offering for the first time in well over a decade a clear strategy and vision for General Practice backed by significant and guaranteed investment over 5 years.

Picking up elements of the GP partnership review there is real term investment in GMS with a comprehensive state backed indemnity scheme, global sum uplift and a new SFE for network participation with guaranteed GMS inflationary increases over 5 years whilst QOF sees further rationalisation. The most radical change however is the introduction of the [New Primary Care Network DES](#) with rapid progression to formal Networks with the appointment of designated Clinical Directors by May 2018 with Networks going live in July. Through these Networks the majority of new investment will be delivered with recurrent funding to support the appointment a range of allied health care professionals to work across Networks member practices and drive forward the integration agenda.

YORLMC welcomes these opportunities and vision this offers to local practices and believes it can protect our individual partnership model whilst bringing economies of scale and resilience. To help practices understand the new contractual framework and the quite radical changes YORLMC has arranged a series of [roadshows across the NYY areas](#) throughout March and this will be backed up by a [YORLMC conference](#) on 3 July dedicated to making Primary Care Networks work. Over the next few weeks further national guidance will emerge. YORLMC is already working with CCGs and other stakeholders to ensure local General Practice gains an increasing voice in the wider implementation of the Long Term Plan and that this new contract delivers to the maximum the much needed investment and support local practices need.
