#### **National role for Dr Brian McGregor**



YORLMC Medical Director Dr Brian McGregor has been elected in a byelection to the General Practitioners Committee (GPC) as representative for North Yorkshire & Bradford.

The GPC is the national body representing GPs and in his new role Brian will represent our local GPs and practices in national discussions and be part of the GPC's campaigning on behalf of all GPs.

Brian is a long-standing member of North Yorkshire LMC and has provided pastoral care over both North Yorkshire and Bradford LMC areas. He will be continuing as YORLMC Medical Director and as a salaried GP along-side his GPC role. He also serves on the LMC Conference (England) agenda committee, setting the agendas for these national conferences which decide GPC England policy for the coming year. The by-election took

place after Dr Dougy Moederle-Lumb, YORLMC Chief Executive, stepped down from the GPC after 11 years representing nationally the interests of GPs across North Yorkshire, Bradford & Airedale. As well as continuing as YORLMC Chief Executive, Dougy also remains Chair of the GPDF, another key national body, which provides support to GPC, LMCs and General Practice.

#### **BMA's NHS pension challenge**

The BMA has <u>written</u> to the Secretary of State of Health and Social Care in England, Matt Hancock, and the governments of the devolved administrations, informing them of their intention to support members in bringing age discrimination claims in an employment tribunal in respect to the discriminatory impact of the 2015 NHS Pension Scheme. The action, by the BMA's legal team, comes in the wake of the Court of Appeal ruling last year which stated that the Government discriminated against judges and firefighters on the grounds of age, race and equal pay in relation to changes to their pension schemes. Although the schemes are different, the BMA believes the underlying legal principles are essentially the same. The outcome of the legal challenges to the judges and firefighters ruling could influence any legal challenge brought on behalf of younger doctors to the legality of the 2015 NHS Pension Scheme.

#### **Annualisation of pensions**

The Government's recent <u>consultation</u> response on the NHS pension scheme contained positive news about fully covering the increase in employers superannuation payments. However it also included much more concerning plans to no longer ignore breaks of up to three months when setting an annual rate of pay for pensions purposes, with the result that GPs' annual rate of pay will now be based on the number of days of pensionable service that they have undertaken during the relevant scheme year. GPC believe this will have a major and unfair impact on GP locums' pension contributions and thus reduce the availability of GP locums resulting in an impact on patient care. GPC will be raising their concerns about the impact of these changes directly with government.

#### **New Clinical Negligence scheme for GPs**

The Clinical Negligence Scheme for General Practice (CNSGP) in England was launched on Monday 1 April, and is being operated by NHS Resolution. # **Confirmation of trainee indemnity arrangement Setting up guidance Updated**

The <u>2019/20 contract agreement</u> secured delivery of the much-awaited state-backed clinical negligence indemnity scheme for GPs in England. <u>Under the scheme</u>, which started on 1st April, all GP trainees placed in GP settings for training purposes will automatically be covered for clinical negligence liabilities – no payments are required to benefit from the indemnity provided. Following further discussions between HEE and the BMA's GPC and GP trainee representatives, GPC can confirm that comprehensive personal indemnity cover for all GP trainees will be funded by HEE

until qualification. This vital professional protection includes, for example, support with GMC investigations and hearings, assistance with criminal proceedings, protection for Good Samaritan acts, and free medicolegal advice. Where a trainee's personal protection is currently provided by a medical defence organisation through a bulk-indemnity agreement, this will continue. Those trainees who purchase their own professional cover should continue to seek full reimbursement until such times as a future bulk-indemnity agreement is arranged by HEE.

#### **Tier 2 Visa Sponsorship**

GPC England has been supporting NHS England and HEE in adding general practice to the Shortage Occupation List and supporting practices to become tier 2 visa sponsors. The number of international graduates working in the NHS continue to drop and there are colleagues who have to return to their country of origin if there is no appropriate sponsoring organisation to support them, so the more practices that can get involved in the process, the better. NHS England will financially support the practices to become sponsoring organisations and more information is <u>available here</u>. Trainees are covered for their time in training via HEE who act as the sponsoring body.

#### Integrated care provider contract

#### **Concerns raised by GPC**

Further to the entry in the February newsletter, NHS England's response is available <a href="here">here</a>. This high-lights the concerns raised by the BMA during the consultation and proposes to make changes to the contract to increase accountability and transparency of ICP organisations. However GPC would continue to caution any practice considering this option as the risks to their future contact remain.

### Continuity of supply of medicines

#### **GPC** guidance

The GPC guidance on proposed changes to the Human Medicines Regulation 2012 to ensure the continuity of supply of medicines (including in a 'no deal' EU exit) is available at <a href="Appendix 3.">Appendix 3.</a>

#### **CQC** Reimbursement

In 2016, GPC negotiated for practices' CQC fees to be fully reimbursed by their Commissioner. This is a practice entitlement, therefore please do claim your local fees back from your local CCG.

#### Prescribing of medicines over the counter

#### **Updated** guidance

GPC England has updated its guidance on prescribing over the counter medicines, with an amendment to acknowledge the 'letter of comfort' issued by NHS England regarding the contractual implications of not providing FP10s for recommended treatments that are available over the counter for minor self-limiting conditions. There is also <a href="here">CCG guidance</a> on routine prescribing in primary care of OTC items, for treatment of conditions which are self-limiting or which lend themselves to self-care. At the request of the GPC, Professor Stephen Powis, National Medical Director, NHS England, also published a <a href="here">letter</a>, providing reassurance the commissioner will not find practices in breach of the GP contract if they follow the CCG guidance.

#### Request for fit to fly letters

#### **Template letter**

Attached at Appendix 4 is guidance and a template fit to fly letter produced by Dr Charlotte Macdonald, YORLMC Harrogate & Rural District Member. Fitness certificates fall outside a GP's NHS Terms and Conditions which means doctors can charge their own rate for undertaking the work however YORLMC cannot suggest a fee. BMA guidance is available here.

#### Return to practice

A new campaign has been launched by NHS England and Health Education England (HEE), backed by the BMA, to encourage GPs to return to practice, with <u>a new web portal</u> for any GPs looking to express their interest in returning. The campaign will promote the Induction and Refresher (I&R) scheme through a digital, social media and print advertising campaign detailing the improvements that the NHS Long Term Plan promises to deliver for general practice. The scheme has so far attracted almost 800 GPs into coming out of retirement, returning to the profession after taking a break or working in another occupation, or moving from overseas.

#### Locum practice agreement

The BMA locum practice agreement is now available. This has been developed jointly by GPC and the sessional GP subcommittee with the help of BMA Law and consists of terms and conditions and a work schedule which together form a legal contract that can be used by locum GPs and GP practices for locum engagements. It is intended to minimise common disputes between locums and practices and clearly outline the type of work that will be undertaken by a locum when working at a practice. It is also intended to protect against locums being categorised as an employee or worker by HMRC for tax purposes or by an employment tribunal for the purposes of statutory employment protection, as well as ensure that there are appropriate arrangements in place for compliance with GDPR. BMA members who use the locum practice agreement can check any terms and conditions they are offered with the BMA contract checking service to ensure they align with the BMA model terms and conditions. Members can also contact the BMA to get advice and support with resolving any disputes if they occur. #### **Antimicrobial resistance**

In January the Government published its UK five-year action plan for anti-microbial resistance, as well as a 20-year vision which present the Government's ambitions and commitments for tackling antimicrobial resistance. #### NHS England primary care website closure

NHS England has informed that the NHS England primary care website <a href="http://www.primarycare.nhs.uk/">http://www.primarycare.nhs.uk/</a> closed on 31<sup>st</sup> March 2019, and that they have notified all practices registered with them via this website. The message advised practices where they need to re-register to new websites where services will continue to be provided as from 1 April. There will be no changes to the data indicators/methodologies or data collections, it is only a move to a new technical system.

General Practice Indicators (GPI) – is moving to a new website: <a href="http://www.primarycareindicators.nhs.uk">http://www.primarycareindicators.nhs.uk</a> where practices can register to use from 1 of April, and the GPI indicators will be visible within from 1 May 2019.

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
