Update from YORLMC for GPs and practice staff in North Yorkshire & York - May 2019

Chair's introduction YORLMC NY Branch Chair, YORLMC Ltd

Since my last report YORLMC has been active in supporting the formation of PCNs across the region and all practices have engaged and are included in the PCN submissions made on May 15th that are currently being approved by CCGs and NHSE. The next steps will be the confirmation of PCN structures and funding flows, the population of Network agreement schedules and developing support and collaboration between PCNs. Again YORLMC is taking a proactive role here including working with GDPF nationally to ensure emerging Clinical Directors get the advice they need and engaging with CCG and STPs . I have had the privilege of chairing YORLMC across North Yorkshire and York for over 12 years. With the support of the YORLMC Board I have decided to relinquish my Chair role, supporting succession planning and to concentrate on the work stream of PCNs and Integrated Care Systems. The document attached (Appendix 1) describes this new role. This decision was not taken lightly but I feel enthusiastic about taking on this important piece of work at a time of unprecedented change for general practice outlined in the recent contract agreement and long term plan.

Over the last 12 years I have really enjoyed meeting the many GPs who have worked on the committees at both Division and Branch and thank them all for their support and valuable input. I could not have performed my role as chair without the fantastic support of my 2 vice chairs who I always really enjoyed working with.

<u>Dr Brian McGregor</u> and I worked together as a great team over 10 years negotiating with commissioners through progressive NHS reorganisations. Brian's new role as Medical Director allows his expertise to support all elements of YORLMC work.

<u>Dr Sally Tyrer</u> has followed in Brian's not insignificant footsteps and rapidly adapted to the vice chair role gaining in confidence and stature. I am delighted to say Sally has been elected to the Chair role. I am sure her attention to detail, skills and commitment will be a massive asset to the committee and look forward to continuing working with her. <u>Dr Jim Woods</u> has also been elected as the new Vice Chair replacing Sally. Jim has a wealth of experience and knowledge to bring to the role.

I would like to thank all the members of YORLMC's Corporate Affairs Team who have supported my role as Chair. Over the 12 years the volume and complexity of work has grown exponentially and their skill and professionalism is second to none. Beyond North Yorkshire, since the inception of YORLMC board we have benefitted from more close working with Bradford colleagues and built up strong and supportive relationships. YORLMC has also established and co-ordinate the <u>Yorkshire & Humber Alliance</u>. I would also like to thank <u>Dr Dougy Lumb</u> who as Chief executive has skilfully supported us all and strategically developed YORLMC to be at the leading edge of LMCs nationally.

It is for all the above reasons I am delighted I am not leaving the organisation and look forward to working with GPs and colleagues to try and ensure the new contractual arrangements support and develop local general practice for the future and that we can play our part in wider system transformation.
