Update from YORLMC for GPs and practice staff in North Yorkshire & York - December 2019

Chair's introduction From YORLMC NY Branch Chair, Dr Sally Tyrer

Since the last edition, I attended the England conference of LMCs alongside several other North Yorkshire representatives <u>Dr Ken Atkinson</u>, <u>Dr Aaron</u> <u>Brown</u>, <u>Dr Cath Dixon</u> and <u>Dr Jim Woods</u>. This is always an interesting conference as it's the mechanism whereby grass roots GPs, via their LMCs, get an opportunity to shape GPC policy for the coming

years. It's also a useful barometer of the mood of the profession as a whole. The key theme coming across was ongoing concerns around workload / capacity, although overall it did feel more positive than previous years. Key Topics included:

• **Home visits** – a passionate debate occurred about whether we still had capacity to do all home visits. This ended up being a broader debate about unmanageable GP workload, and the vote was narrowly approved asking GPC to negotiate a separate funded service to provide visits. Given the level of coverage about this, it's important to point out nothing will change imminently, and regardless of what is ultimately negotiated, nothing will prevent GPs still being able to still visit those patients that they choose to such as the vulnerable / frail / terminally ill.

• **NHSPS** – Following protracted negotiations with NHSE / NHSPS, the BMA have made the decision to take NHSPS to court over the issue of service charges for GP premises

• **Medication shortages** – it was agreed that additional resources were required to manage the workload involved with the increasing number of drugs unavailable.

There was also a debate about PCNs in general with concerns raised about unrealistic expectations and demands. Overall there was some positivity about them, and the vote to scrap PCNs altogether was lost. It was agreed that GPC should negotiate more flexibility around the additional staff roles PCNs can recruit; that Clinical Directors should have clear access to funded sick / parental leave; and be funded equally rather than based on size of PCN. There was also a request for clear legal and accounting advice with further changes to the DES. Locally, PCNs are starting to think about how they will use their development monies, and are trying to recruit pharmacists and social prescribers to ensure they make the most of the additional roles allocation available. <u>See here for Conference resolutions</u> and here for <u>webcast</u>.
